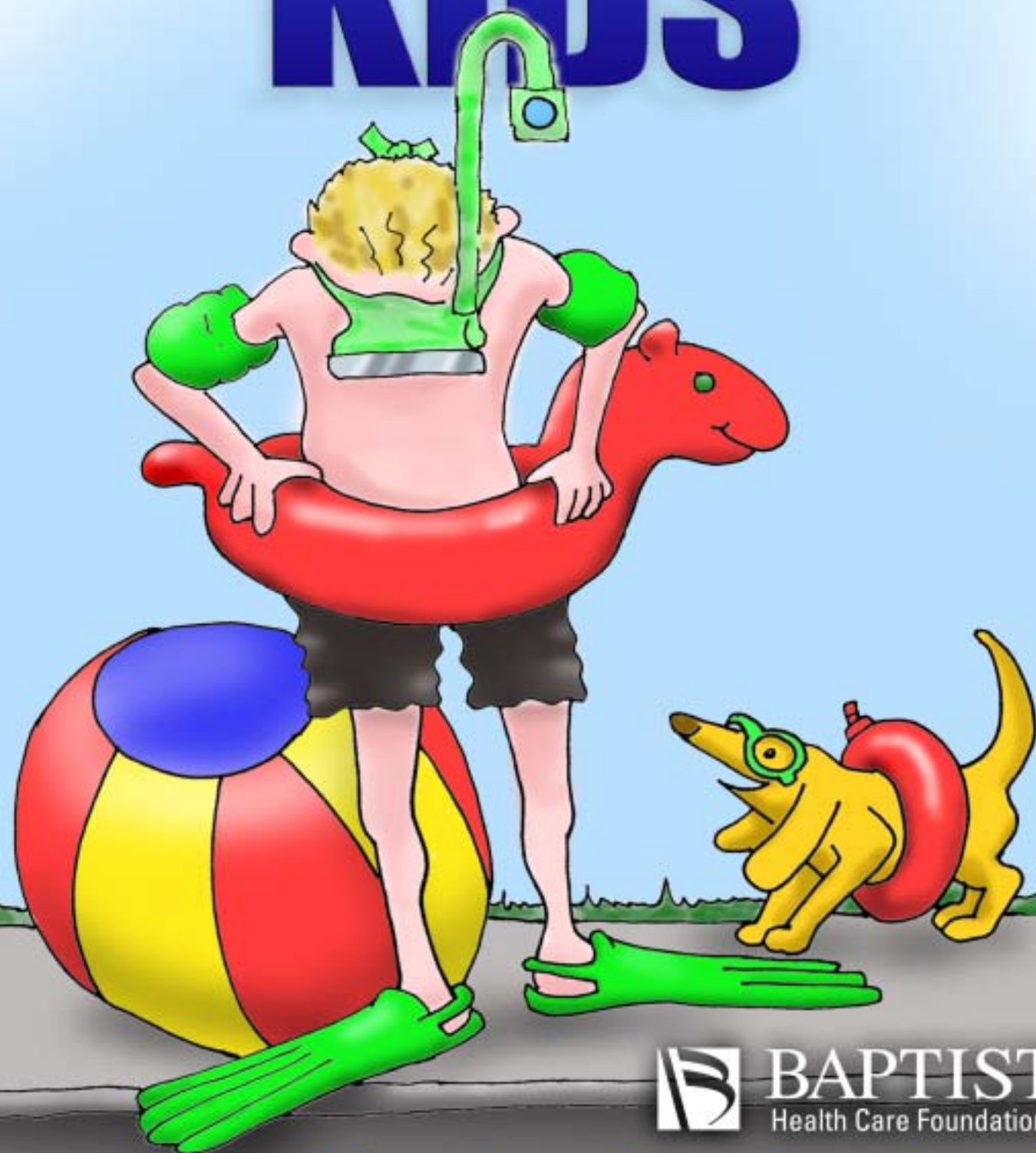

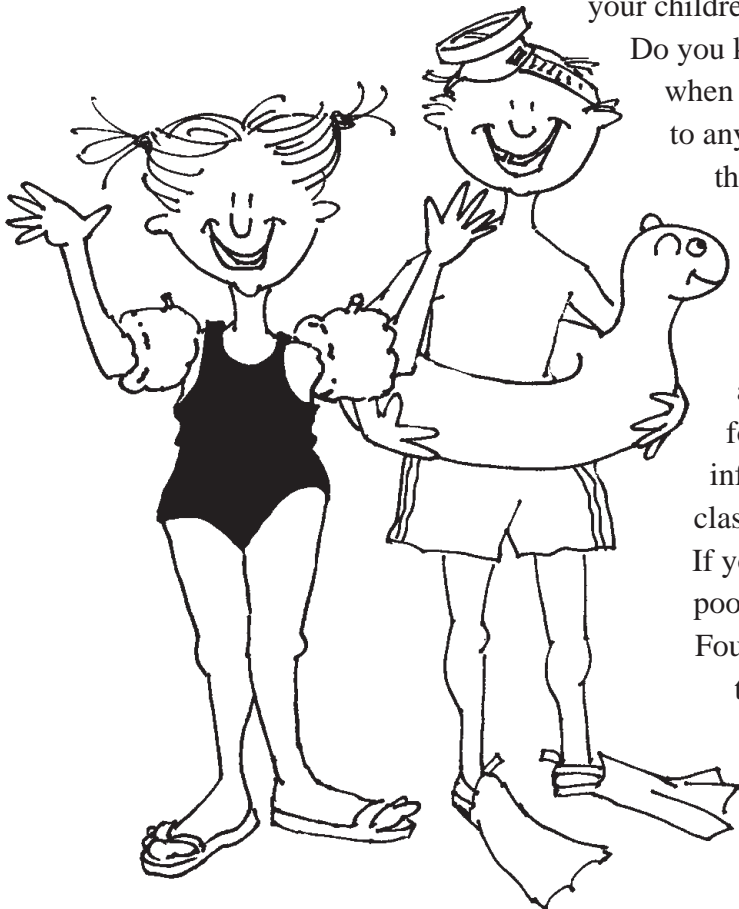

Over the years, Baptist Health Care Foundation has taken steps to ensure the safety of children in the community. The Foundation supports water safety initiatives such as PoolSafe to teach children and pool owners how to be safer in and around pools. Another program is Three Flags for Life, an innovative full-color rack card program originally designed for visitor centers, welcome center, hotels and businesses to teach the importance of beach safety and the flag warning system.

The main purpose of this coloring book is to illustrate to children what it means to be a pool safe kid. But it also should act as a reminder of your responsibilities as a pool owner. Maintenance on your pool should include more than changing the chlorine. Do you have a fence protecting your children from wandering and falling into the pool?

Do you know CPR, and would you know how and when to perform if you needed to? If you said no to any of these questions, now's the time to make the changes.



Go through this book with your children and find out what they, or you, don't know about pool safety. The best thing you can do for the safety of your child is to become informed about pool safety. Suddenly, Taylor can't find Freckles. He looks and looks and can't find his new puppy!



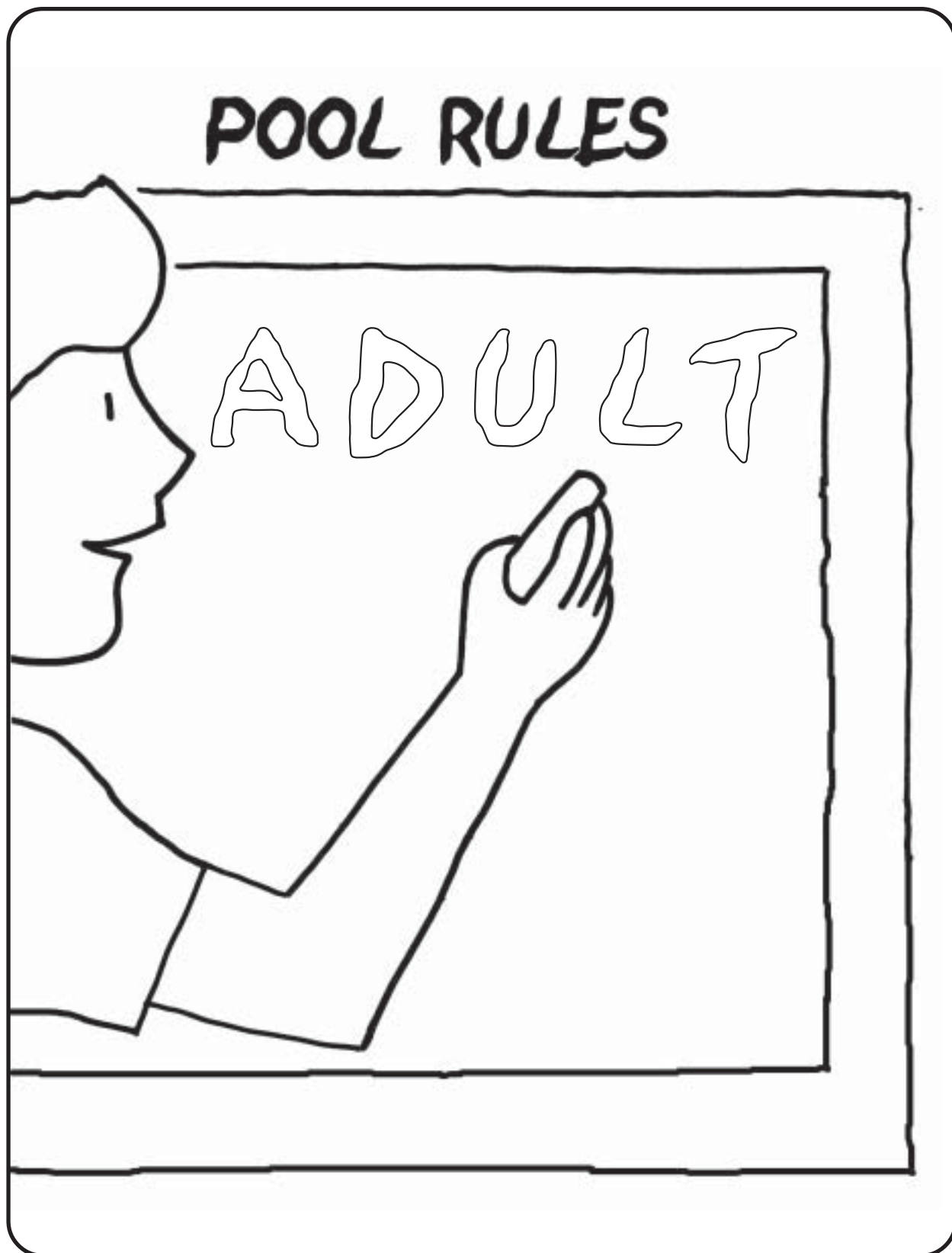
Mr. Conner saw Freckles in the pool, struggling to stay above the water. He jumps in to help.

Taylor and his friends decide to make rules for the pool so little kids and puppies won't get hurt. Mr. Conner gets the chalk board to write down the rules.



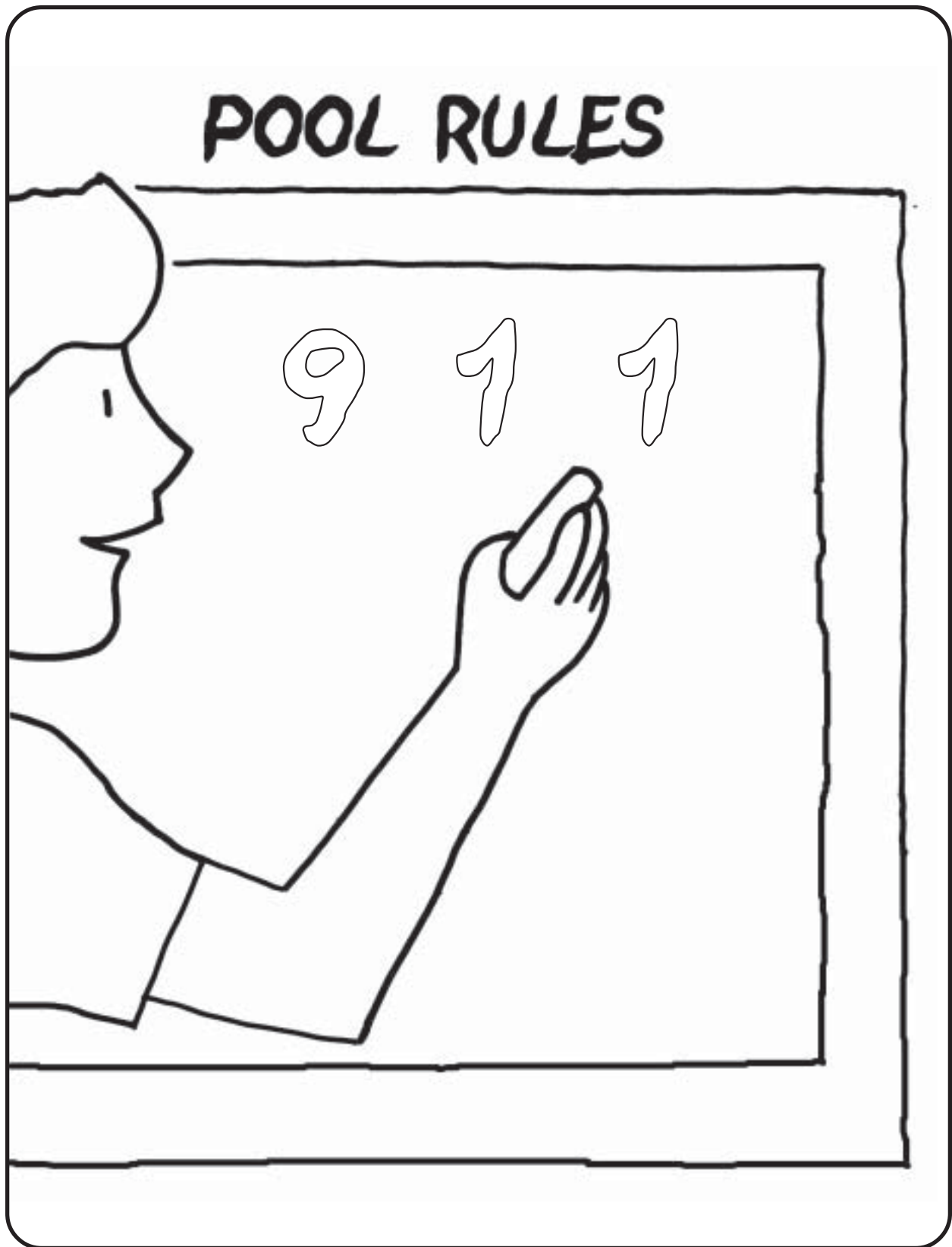

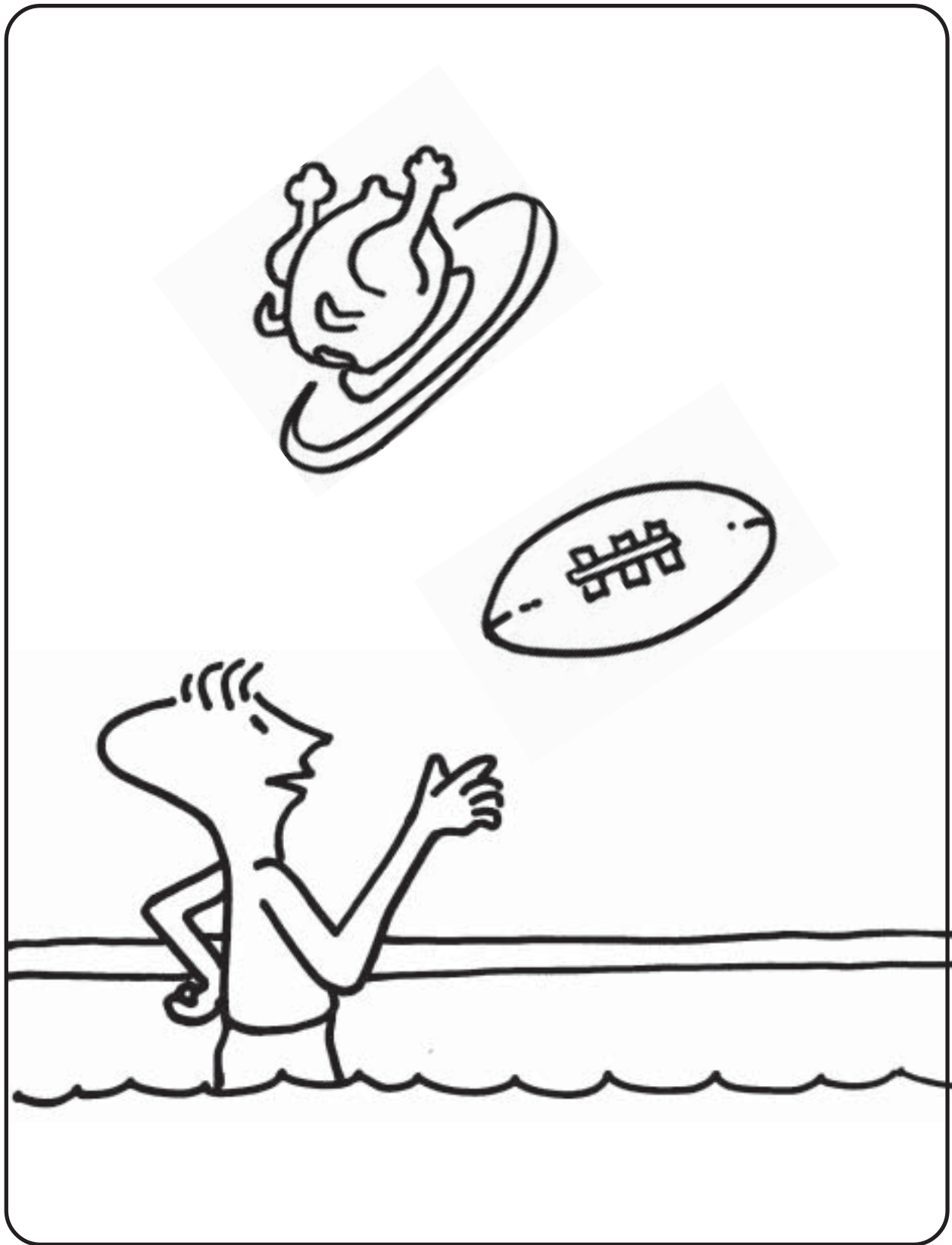
